Tree City USA Standards

To qualify as a Tree City USA community, you must meet four standards established by the Arbor Day Foundation and the National Association of State Foresters. These standards were established to ensure that every qualifying [community*](#) would have a viable tree management program and that no community would be excluded because of size.

Four Standards for Tree City USA Recognition

■ Standard 1 | ■ Standard 2 | ■ Standard 3 | ■ Standard 4

Standard 1

A Tree Board or Department

Someone must be legally responsible for the care of all trees on city- or town-owned property. By delegating tree care decisions to a professional forester, arborist, city department, citizen-led tree board or some combination, city leaders determine who will perform necessary tree work. The public will also know who is accountable for decisions that impact community trees. Often, both professional staff and an advisory tree board are established, which is a good goal for most communities.

The formation of a tree board often stems from a group of citizens. In some cases a mayor or city officials have started the process. Either way, the benefits are immense. Involving residents and business owners creates wide awareness of what trees do for the community and provides broad support for better tree care.

Standard 2

A Tree Care Ordinance

A basic public tree care ordinance forms the foundation of a city's tree care program. It provides an opportunity to set good policy and back it with the force of law when necessary.

A key section of a qualifying ordinance is one that establishes the tree board or forestry department—or both—and gives one of them the responsibility for public tree care (as reflected in Standard 1). It should also assign the task of crafting and implementing a plan of work or for documenting annual tree care activities.

Ideally, the ordinance will also provide clear guidance for planting, maintaining and removing trees from streets, parks and other public spaces as well as activities that are required or prohibited. Beyond that, the ordinance should be flexible enough to fit the needs and circumstances of the particular community.

Standard 3

A Community Forestry Program With an Annual Budget of at Least \$2 Per Capita

City trees provide many benefits—clean air, clean water, shade and beauty to name a few—but they also require an investment to remain healthy and sustainable. By providing support at or above the \$2 per capita minimum, a community demonstrates its commitment to grow and tend these valuable public assets. Budgets and expenditures require planning and accountability, which are fundamental to the long-term health of the tree canopy and the Tree City USA program.

 To meet this standard each year, the community must document at least \$2 per capita toward the planting, care and removal of city trees—and the planning efforts to make those things happen. At first this may seem like an impossible barrier to some communities. However, a little investigation usually reveals that more than this amount is already being spent on tree care. If not, this may signal serious neglect that will cost far more in the long run. In such a case, working toward Tree City USA recognition can be used to reexamine the community's budget priorities and redirect funds to properly care for its tree resources before it is too late.

Standard 4

An Arbor Day Observance and Proclamation

An effective program for community trees would not be complete without an annual Arbor Day ceremony. Citizens join together to celebrate the benefits of community trees and the work accomplished to plant and maintain them. By passing and reciting an official Arbor Day proclamation, public officials demonstrate their support for the community tree program and complete the requirements for becoming a Tree City USA!

This is the least challenging—and probably most enjoyable—standard to meet. An Arbor Day celebration can be simple and brief or an all-day or all-week observation. It can include a tree planting event, tree care activities or an award ceremony that honors leading tree planters. For children, Arbor Day may be their only exposure to the green world or a springboard to discussions about the complex issue of environmental quality.

The benefits of Arbor Day go far beyond the shade and beauty of new trees for the next generation. Arbor Day is a golden opportunity for publicity and to educate homeowners about proper tree care. Utility companies can join in to promote planting small trees beneath power lines or being careful when digging. Fire prevention messaging can also be worked into the event, as can conservation education about soil erosion or the need to protect wildlife habitat.

TREE CARE ORDINANCE

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS

STREET TREES: “Street Trees” are defined as trees, on land lying between property lines on either side of all streets or right of ways within the Town.

PARK TREES: “Park Trees” are defined as trees, in public parks or areas owned by the Town.

SECTION 2. CREATION AND ESTABLISHMENT OF A TREE BOARD

The Keep Shady Shores Beautiful board shall serve as the Tree Board for the Town of Shady Shores.

SECTION 3. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

It shall be the responsibility of the Board to study investigate and develop and/or update every two years, and administer a written plan for the care, preservation, pruning, planting, replanting, removal and disposition of trees and in parks, along streets in other public areas. If no updates are necessary, the plan will remain the same. Such plan will be presented to the Town Council and upon their acceptance and approval shall constitute the official comprehensive tree plan for the Town of shady Shores.

The Board when requested by the Town Council shall consider, investigate, make finding, report, and recommend upon any special matter of question coming within the scope of this work.

SECTION 4. STREET TREE SPECIES TO BE PLANTED

The following list constitutes the official Street Tree Species for the Town of Shady Shores. No species other than those included in this list may be planted as Street Trees without the approval and written permission of the Tree Board.

Live Oak,
Cedar Elm
Red Oak
Bur Oak
Chinquapin Oak
Pecan
Pistachio

SECTION 5. SPACING

The spacing of Street Trees will be in accordance with the three species size classes listed in Section 4 of this Ordinance, and no trees may be planted closer together than the following: Large Trees 40'; except in special plantings designed or approved by an landscape architect.

SECTION 6. DISTANCE FROM CURB, SIDEWALK AND STREET

The distance trees may be planted from curb, curb line, sidewalks and or road right of ways will be in accordance with this ordinance and no trees may be planted closer to any curb or sidewalk or right of way than Large Trees 4'.

No Trees of any size shall be planted in the bar ditches.

SECTION 7. DISTANCE FROM STREET CORNERS AND FIREPLUGS

No Street Tree shall be planted closer than 35' of any street corner measured from the nearest intersecting curb, curb line or road right of way. Not Street Tree shall be planted closer than 10' of any fireplug.

SECTION 8. UTILITIES

No Street Trees other than those species listed as Small Trees in Section 5 of this ordinance may be planted under or within 10 lateral feet of any overhead utility wire, or over or within 5 lateral feet of any underground water line, sewer line, transmission or other utility.

SECTION 9. TREE TOPPING

It shall be unlawful as a normal practice for any person, firm, or Town department to top any Street Tree park tree or other tree on public property. Topping is defined as the severe cutting back of limbs to stubs larger than three inches in diameter within the tree's crown to disfigure the tree. Trees severely damaged by storms or other causes, or certain trees under utility wires or other obstructions where other pruning practices are impractical may be exempted from this ordinance at the determination of the Tree Board.

SECTION 10. PRUNING, CORNER CLEARANCE

Every owner of any tree overhanging any street or right-of-way within the Town shall prune the branches so that such branches shall not obstruct the light from any street lamp or obstruct the view of any street intersection and so that there shall be a clear space of fourteen (14') feet above the surface of the street or sidewalk. Said owners shall remove dead, diseased or dangerous trees, or broken or decayed limbs which constitute a menace to the safety of the public. The Town shall have the right to prune any tree or shrub on private property when it interferes with the proper spread of light along the street from a streetlight or interferes with visibility of any traffic control device or sign.

SECTION 11. REMOVAL OF STUMPS

All stumps of street and park trees shall be removed below the surface of the ground so that the top of the stump shall not project above the surface of the ground.

SECTION 12. INTERFERENCE WITH TOWN TREE BOARD

It shall be unlawful for any person to prevent, delay or interfere with the City Tree Board, or any of its agents, while engaging in and about the planting, cultivating, mulching, pruning, spraying, or removing of any Street Trees, Park Trees, or trees on private grounds, as authorized in this ordinance.

SECTION 13. REVIEW BY TOWN COUNCIL

The Town Council shall have the right to review the conduct, acts and decisions of the Town Tree Board. Any person may appeal from any ruling or order of the Town Tree Board to the Town Commission who may hear the matter and make final decision.

SECTION 14. PENALTY

Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall be, upon conviction or a plea of guilty, subject to a fine not to exceed \$500.

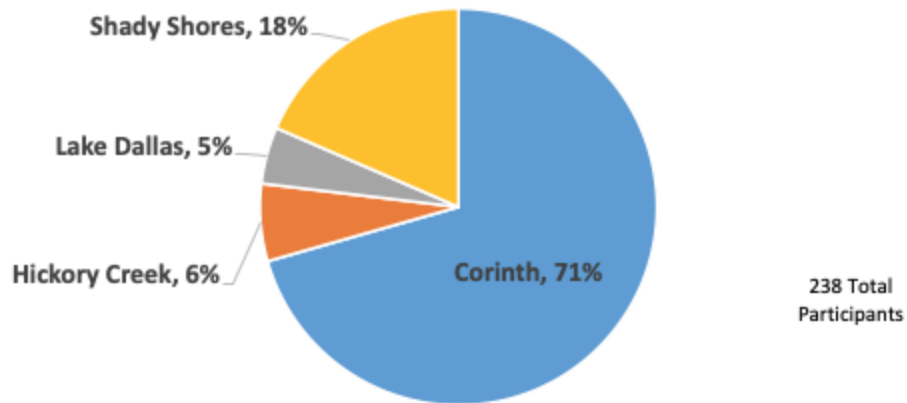

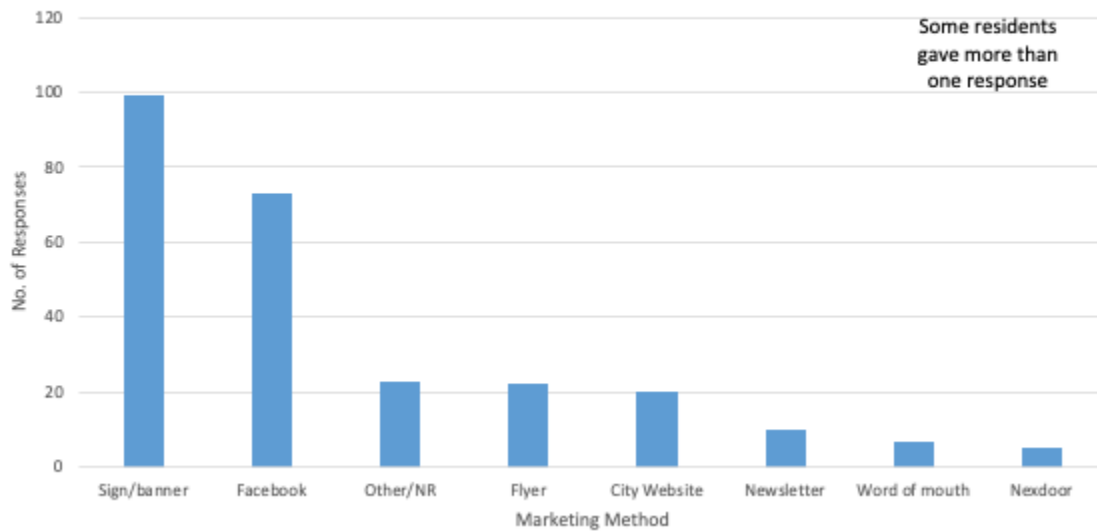

Hope you had a nice weekend and a Happy Thanksgiving!

Here are the sketch/design, plant recommendations, and proposals we discussed for KSSB/Town Hall. Should I plan on attending tomorrow?

Walking Path – 3ft wide x 925ft long

Concrete Path – \$21,543

Gravel Path (Decomposed Granite with steel edging) – \$14,847

Mulch Path – \$6,748

70ft x 20ft Butterfly Garden (see design and detailed estimate attached)

Installation (prep, plants, and mulch) - \$8,843.50

Irrigation (2 new drip irrigation zones) - \$3,750

Plant Signs (signs to identify the different plants) - \$1,250

We also discussed adding a Live Oak and/or Cedar Elm tree to increase the tree diversity. Here is pricing for that:

Install 3" Live Oak (and irrigation) - \$695

Install 3" Cedar Elm (and irrigation) - \$695

If you would like additional information on anything or if you would like to see any adjustments/changes, please let me know. I will finish up the sketch for the walking path once they decide which option they prefer.

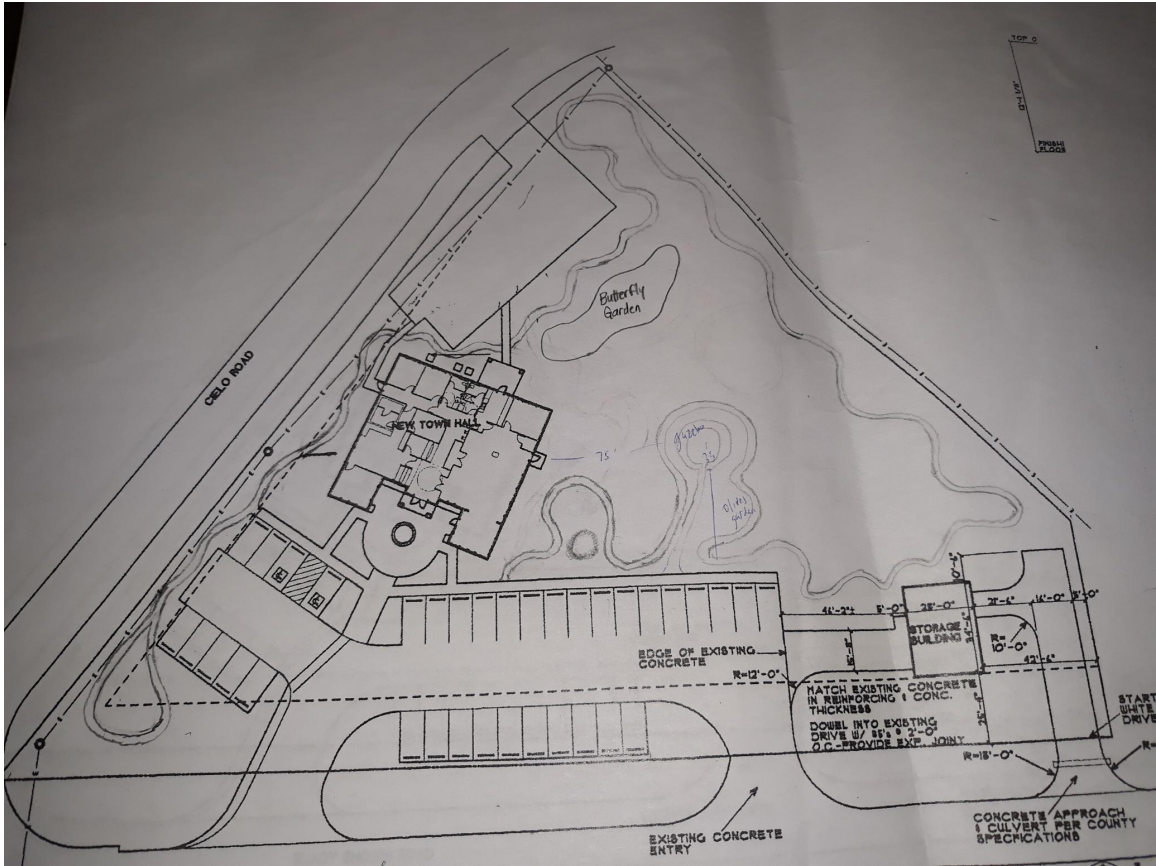

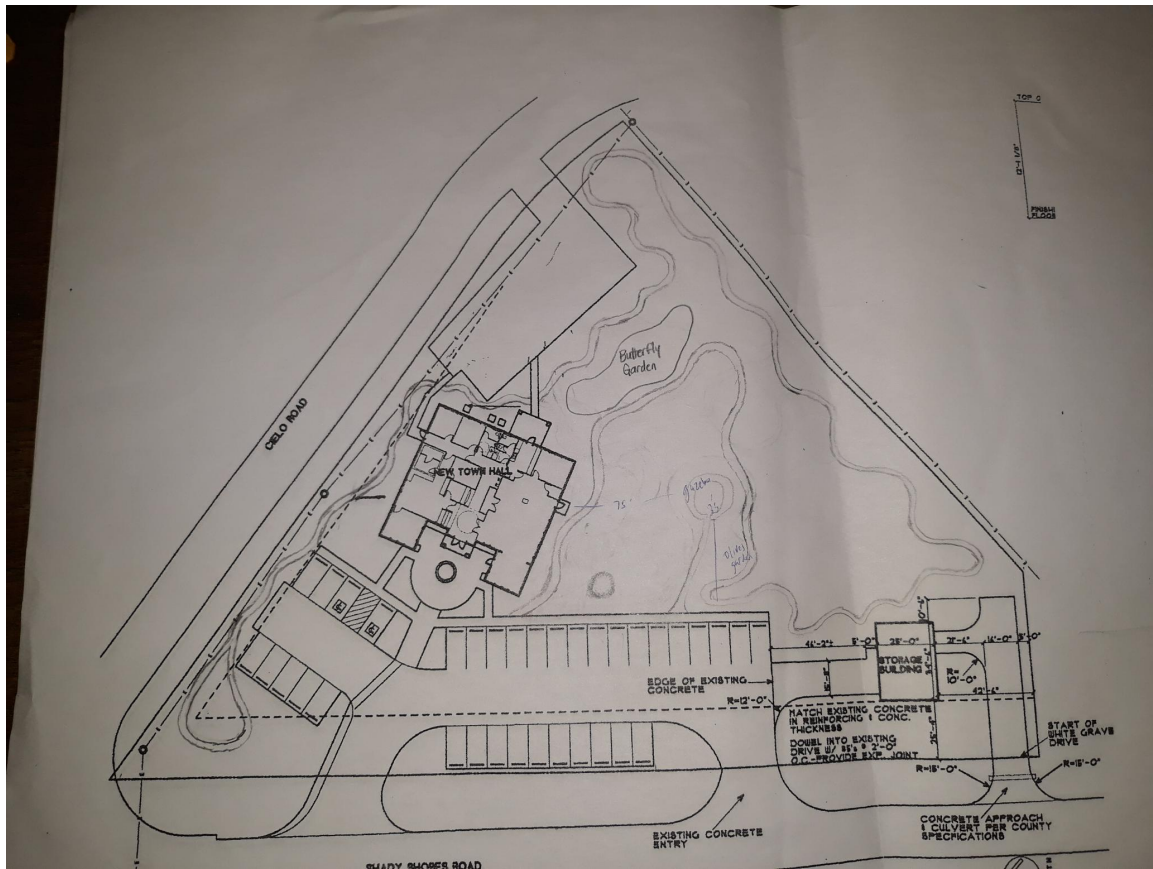

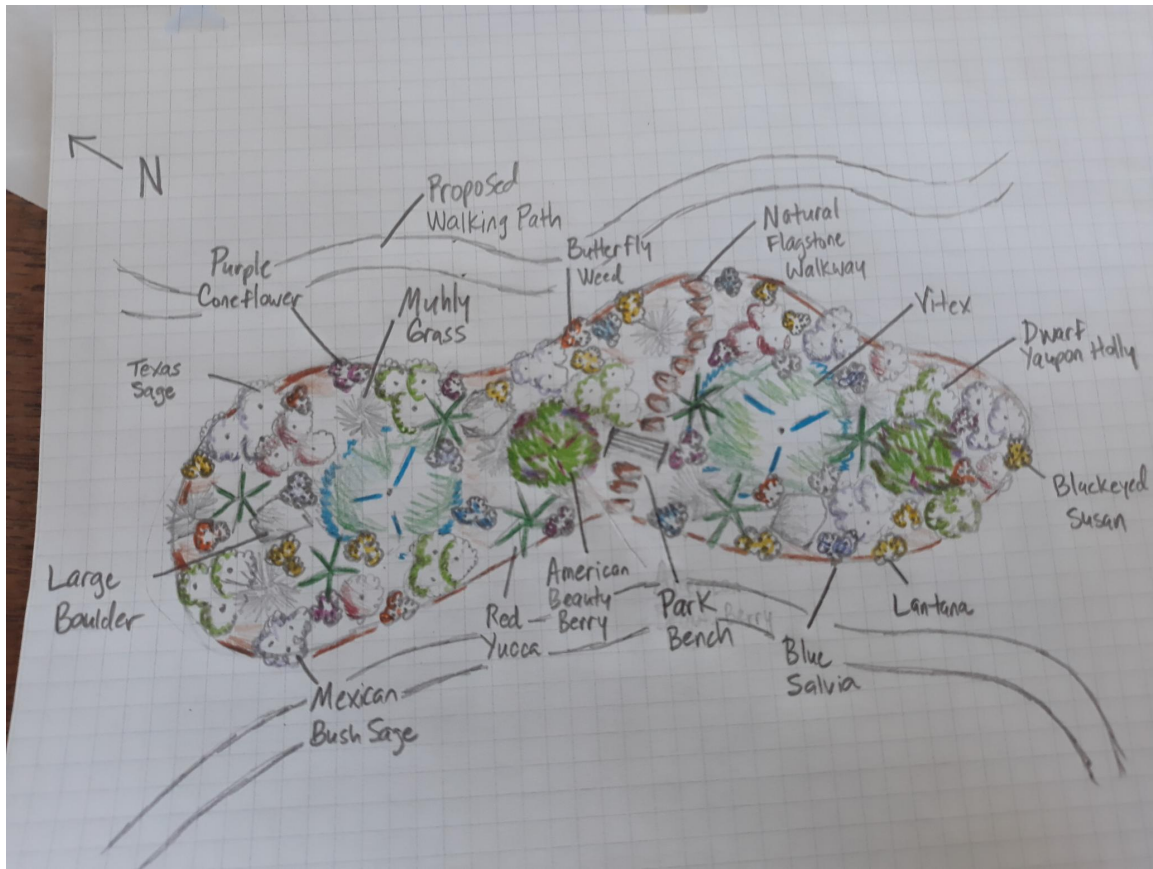

BACKGROUND/INFORMATION:

Recap of the brick sales concept. Approve the form and advertising efforts. Discuss other possible fundraisers for the Butterfly Garden and walking path. Such as T-Shirt sales etc. Article for the newsletter

In Memory of or In Honor of:

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The 4x8x 2 1/4 bricks which are standard size are priced at \$19.50. The Town Could Charge \$30 per brick or any other amount they choose.

RECOMMENDATION/ACTION DESIRED:

As a committee of the town, they can solicit donations to the Town for the project. Donors to the Town are making a tax deductible gift, subject to the provisions of the Internal Revenue code. Those rules deal with the income of the donor, the size of the gift, other gifts made by the donor, etc.

As a committee of the town, the council has the final say over the expenditures made from the donations.

They would want to be sure the council is on board with both the kind of solicitations, and the planned expenditures before they go to far.

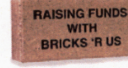

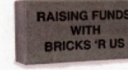
