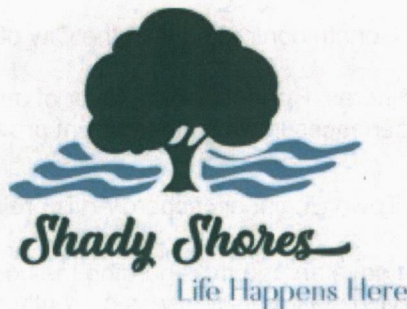

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Aughinbaugh called the meeting to order at 6:01 pm.

COUNCIL WORKSESSION

1. Worksession Discussion Items

A) Police Contract- Consider and discuss approval of renewal of the Contract for Patrol Services with the City of Corinth.

Chief Jerry Garner was present to answer questions regarding the proposed contract. Chief Garner stated that most of the proposed cost increase would be due to the addition of animal control services. There is a fixed rate increase of 3.5% each year.

Mayor Pro Tem Tom Newell, who serves as the Police Department Liaison stated that with current hiring expectations, he felt the pricing was fair. The department would be fully staffed with 36 officers and there were 25 currently on staff.

Citizens on Patrol, is still an active group, and there is a core group of citizens that like to perform those services.

Other comments included:

Minimum staffing, minimum of 5 officers at night and four during the daytime. In addition, there are officers that could be pulled to meet the requirements (such as the school resource officer)

Councilmember Bill Emsoff asked if the Corinth had their own dispatch to which it was explained that calls come through Denton County Dispatch.

Councilmember Charles Grimes asked about the animal shelter and whether it was a no-kill shelter. Chief

Garner replied that the City of Corinth contracted with the City of Lake Dallas for Animal Control services.

Frank Graham 324 S. Shady Shores Road, spoke in favor of an animal control agreement with the City of Corinth, as he had several experiences in which the current provider was too far from Shady Shores to respond to an afterhours call.

B) Street Light- Receive a presentation from Town Engineer Richard Arvizu relative to the placement and cost of streetlight for the Town of Shady Shores.

Town Engineer Richard Arvizu gave an update regarding the cost and placement of streetlighting for the Town of Shady Shores, Mr. Arvizu stated his firm was currently recommending light pole that would be compliance with the Dark Sky Community. The actual installation costs are still being evaluated which will help the Council make future decisions relative to the placement of these lights.

Bill Krueger, 2013 Cielo Lane, mentioned the 1.5' candles and 3' ratio- an average of 1.5 throughout the intersection, measured at ground level or above ground level, Color temperature of the lamps, stating the warm yellows are nice architecturally, but the whiter lights are nicer brighter. Mr. Krueger stated that he felt this was a good first step and was looking forward to seeing the outcome.

Monty Hilliard 239 Garza Lane, stated that he had been trying to save the town money and that he has fixed the pole at the end of his street many times. Mr. Hilliard recommended placing the light on the opposite side of the road to keep people from running into the pole.

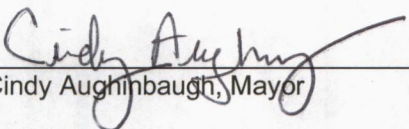

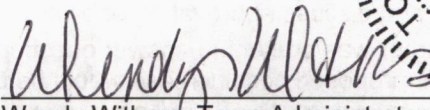
