Can The Committee was asked to offer recommendations for a Litter Ordinance. Two examples were presented.

The committee chose to vote on whether or not the committee desires to make recommendations to the Town Council.

Recommendations from the committee are as follows:

- 1) The ordinance should dovetail into the existing ordinance of the town, making it clear for the reader. For example, Trash and Debris are addressed, but "litter" is not used. Construction Waste is addressed in one area of the ordinance but not in another- would a reader know to look in both places?
- 2) Language and definitions should be easy to follow and understand for the reader. For example, the City of Lufkin Ordinance 4018 was easy to understand and inclusive of important concerns being addressed.
- 3) Current definitions may need to be updated to include such things as non-decomposable materials.

The KSSB committee did want to present a question to the Town Council:

If a state law exists regarding littering, what benefit is it to the Town to have an ordinance?

- Can the town enforce a state law and therefore not need an additional ordinance in the books?

How does it fit with the overall capital improvement plan

Conversations with Toll Brothers about possible walking path easement to USACE trails- Cielo / McClintock- access point – investigated and placed on hold until further information is gathered.

Public Hearing tentative scheduled 1st Quarter 2024

Recommendations we have gathered for consideration and planning:

- Reducing speed limits along Lakeshore and other areas where designated pedestrian and cycle traffic might be identified
- Ordinance requiring construction of trail facilities as shown on adopted master trail plan by new developments

Questions for the board/larger group:
